#### **Brief Introduction**

RWDS has been working in Tiruvannamalai district a declared drought prone district in Tamil Nadu. The district has very low literacy rate of less than 30%. The problem of illiteracy is more acute among the dalit women who are victims of caste, class and gender discriminations. Most rural areas are denied of the basic amenities, the right to education, and the right to access to health and health care and right to gender equality. Domestic violence is more prevalent in the district. Women are left to the mercy of the alcoholic addict husbands and suffer from physical violence, desertion and polygamy. These women are vulnerable to sexual violence both in private and public spheres.

The change and modern practices in agriculture have deprived their traditional occupancy and increased unemployment. Unemployment, poverty and starvation have forced many unorganized laborers to migrate to Chennai, Bangalore and other small towns in search of work. The migrated men setup a family of their own in the newly migrated place and ignore to take care of the family left behind. In such a situation the number of single women headed household in the area has been on the increase.

Girl children are forced to be at home to take care of their younger siblings and to attend to the domestic needs. Agricultural lands have been alienated; food crops have paved their way to cash crops. Traditional farming, food and grains have disappeared. The excessive usages of hazardous chemical fertilizers and pesticides not only have poisoned the land, food and seeds but also have increased the food insecurity.

It is in this back drop that RWDS has been working in the district of Tiruvannamalai. The organization has been working in 40 villages of Pudhupalayam

and Kalasapakkam blocks in Tiruvannamalai district aiming to enhance their economic status and thereby to enhance the equality of status of women as participants, decision-makers and beneficiaries in the democratic, economic, social and cultural spheres of life.

This report is a consolidation of activities carried out during the reporting period covering from April 2016 to March 2017.

#### 4. Commemoration of International Women's Day

March 8, the International Women's Day was commemorated at Kanchi, Tiruvannamalai. The chief guest shared about the importance of the Day and asked the women to be brave and to insist their children to pursue education. Importance was insisted for keeping their villages neat and clean. Guests of honor were officials from health department. They shared about the relevance of the day.

#### 5. Continuation of distribution of Revolving Fund for economic development

A total of 146 beneficiaries were selected in the first batch earlier year. Among them 13 are widows, 3 are destitute and the rest of the 130 are below poverty line women. The mode of utilization of the loan amount was left to the beneficiaries. Each one could choose the venture of her own. Each month each beneficiary has to reimburse either Rs.330/ or Rs.550/-, in proportionate to the quantum of loan borrowed. Each group is responsible for ensuring the reimbursement. Agreement was entered into with each group by way of adhering to legal compliance.

The beneficiaries started to reimburse the loans as per the resolutions of their respective groups.

Out of the revolving fund till the reporting date 110 beneficiaries have benefitted through the scheme of revolving. They are engaged in various economic activities which are fetching them income and the same has helped them to increase their income and thereby socio economic status.

#### 6. Support for Income Generation Activity -IGA

Support was given to women involved in collective farming for purchase of cows under IGA. The beneficiaries were repaying the money in 10 installments of Rs. 3000 each per month. From the reimbursed money, another 35 beneficiaries were supported with an amount of Rs.30000/- each during the reporting period for purchase of cows. The beneficiaries were required to produce documentary supports. After submission of basic required documents, money was deposited in

the individual bank accounts. Each beneficiary was given a cheque to the tune of Rs. 30000/- each. They withdrew the money and purchased cows. Tokens were issued and the cows were insured.

On 22.02.2017, thirty two members had an exposure to Kalvi Kendra, at Villupuram. The exposure helped them to learn different methods of functioning of groups especially loan management, economic activities and ventures to be effectively managed by women.

On 04.03.2017, another batch had an opportunity to visit BWDA Villupuram. The Director welcomed the participants and shared the brief history of BWDA. He mentioned that BWDA was started in the year 1985. The organization imparts skill training, family holiday school, health support programs in addition to consolidating the SHGs. They run the programs of Financial Inclusion, Education, Relief and Rehabilitation, women and Child empowerment, Bullock Cart Workers Development, Water & Sanitation, Livelihood Development, Senior Citizens empowerment and environment & Animal Welfare. The participants learnt to maintain various

documents pertaining to meetings loan disbursement and reimbursement and maintenance of daily accounts of the economic activity.

#### 9. Promotion of Children's Club

- Children's Club formed in all villages.
- Children's Club students were attending the Grama Sabha Meetings and were discuss about their needs like playing materials as well as their were planting the seeds
- Streets were cleaned by the Children's Club students
- Kitchen garden were formed
- Children's Parliament were conducted

Summer camp organized for the children's club members. They were given training on health and hygiene, child rights, environmental protection and other important themes. Evening school programs.

#### 10. Formation of Environment Protection Forum

In all the twenty villages initiatives have been taken for promotion of Farmer's club, Women's club, Children's Club and youth club. Potential members are identified and enrolled in sangams (groups).

#### 11. Adolescent Life Skill Education

Life skill trainings were imparted to adolescent children. Permission was sought at the school levels and clubs were formed at school levels. These children were trained on cleanliness, health aspects and other important issues that are concerned for the children. The children are now respecting elders and the language they use is respectful.

#### 12. Promoting sustainable agriculture

Under the concept of collective farming, 4 landless agricultural cooli women and one small woman farmers having agriculture land with water source selected for

this intervention. This 4+1 jointed together and formed as collective farming group. The leaders were taken for a learning exposure to Auraville, where they had an opportunity to interact with the farmer Thomas who has been involved in organic farming for the past twenty five years. At the end of the program the farmers expressed that they could learn from the exposure and it instilled confidence among them to involve without any apprehension

After the exposure visit, they took lease land from their group member and started doing farming activity organically. Each Collective farming group received Rs. 10000 as seed money for initiating farming activities. End of the cultivation period, the benefit was shared equally after paid the lease. Each member got Rs.3000 as cash and also received vegetables for their own consumption.

Under the scheme Vermi rearing programme, bio fertilizers preparation, seeds and saplings, exposure programme for farmers, sri-rice cultivation & demonstration plot were promoted among them. At Alliyanthal village 13 families have started to prepare vermin compost and are cultivating the same. 50 families have adapted organic farming and have started harvesting.

#### Conclusion

RWDS has successfully implemented the programs as planned and have supported the people to get sensitized on the issues required to make them as law abiding citizens and to avail the government schemes. RWDS has supported poor women to increase their income through economic development programs. We have been associating with government departments, health departments and are thankful for everyone who has been of immense support to us.
