Milks Cows-IGP

Support was given to women involved in collective farming for purchase of cows under IGP. In the month of April, 2015, twenty beneficiaries were given Rs. 30000/- each for purchase of cows. In the month of September six beneficiaries and March-2016 2 Beneficiaries were given Rs. 30000/- each for purchase of cows. The beneficiaries were required to produce documentary supports. After submission of basic required documents, money was deposited in the Individual bank accounts. Each beneficiary was given a cheque to the tune of Rs. 30000/- each. They withdrew the money and purchased cows. Tokens were issued and the cows were insured. The beneficiaries make a repayment of Rs. 3000 per month. From the reimbursement till the reporting period 28 beneficiaries were supported

Changes in the life of the people:

The support extended has been found to be very useful for the people and it has made few positive results in their lives. All the cows beneficiaries are regularly making the monthly repayment from the income they get. There have been social benefits to the families. Following are few examples:

Lakshmi W/o Shanmugam, Nammiyandal has been regularly repaying and from the balance saving she is able to support her family for repairing her house.

Deepa W/o Raji, from Nammiyandal Village is able to send her children to English medium school from the earnings out of the income. She is focused to ensure better education for her children.

From the income she earns Chandra W/o Venkatesan, from Anandhal Village, is able to send her daughter for higher education. Her daughter has joined Ist year in college

Chinnapapa W/o Duraisami from Anandhal Village is able to send her son for higher education in college.

Pudural W/o kannan, from Oranthavady was able to meet the medical expenses of her husband and hers.

Poonkavanam W/o Govindaraj from Oranthavady is able to take care of the expenses for their family and her daughter's family. The daughter lost her husband and Poonkavanam is taking care of both families.

Value based school program

Objective:

The objective of the program is to sensitize the teachers to motivate children on the need and importance of organic agricultural practices and to inculcate the habit among the students

Implemented activities:

Two schools were selected for value based school programs, one at a middle school in Oranthavdai and the other at a primary school in Nathavady.

Survey of the schools was conducted in which the details of teachers, children and the potential for the intervention were assessed. Following the same interactions were held at the teachers level. They were motivated to involve in the program.

The Oranthavady school has four teachers two female and two male teachers. The school has forty eight girl children and forty two boys. Nathavady school has two male teachers for twenty children (ten girls and ten boys).

After the interaction the teachers expressed their support for the program. Hence agricultural tools were distributed to the schools. This was followed by supply of seeds. The teachers have made the children to sow the seeds and now the plants have started growing.

School Programme

1. Lalitha w/o Rathinam Sathyapuram Village Kallaraipady Post Chengam Taluk, Tiruvannamalai

I hail from a poor dalit family. I have one daughter and one son and they are married. Through Ecomwel Project I got a goat under the goat rotation scheme. The goat gave birth to a male lamb and after three months the goat gave birth to three lambs. Out of which I gave back one to the organization. Now the goat has given birth for the third time. Now I have 7 goats. They give birth in rotation. I am catering them well and am thankful for the organization and to ECOMWEL.

Case Study -2

2. Chandra w/o Venketesan Annanthal village; Vasudevanpattu post; Chengam Taluk, Tiruvannamalai District

I am from the Annanthal village and I have two sons and a daughter. I am the women's group leader from my village. My one acre land was selected for collective farming. We cultivated the land collectively adopting the methods of organic farming. We were given cows. My cow gives 5 liters of milk per day. The dung and other wastes are used for manure and for preparation of natural pest controllers. I earn Rs.3000/- through the sale of milk. I am using the money for the higher education of my daughter who is studying in 2nd year college at Queen Mary's College, Chennai.

Case Study -3

3. Karpagam w/o Anbu Mottur Village Alathur Post Chengam Taluk, Tiruvannamalai District

I belong to a poor dalit family. Out of the marriage I have three children. Being poor and belonging to the most discriminated dalit caste I was facing only humiliation from others. Being a woman I was further subjugated to torture.

I joined as a member of the group promoted by RWDS. They helped me with a milch cow. The cow gives four and half liters of milk each day. It is an additional income for the family. We are able to provide milk for the children. That helps to increase their nutrition. The balance milk is sold in the market. The money is saved and used for the education of my daughter.

II Project title :- Food Security of Poor & Marginalizes Communities

Objective:

To enable rural marginalized farming women to adopt organic farming practices towards ensuring production of safe and secure food

Activities implemented

Field demonstration and demonstration of bio manure preparation

Five groups were selected from Nandhimangalam, Mottur, Viswanathapuram and Gangampattu (2 groups).

First soil test undertaken and seeds selected suitable for that land. By adaptation of 'Moodakku murai' seeds planted. Now plants have grown. 10 varieties of seeds given to 15 groups

In Nandhi mangalam pst attack was there on ladies finger plants. For that bio pest control was prepared and used.

All the five groups were given vermin compost tanks, earthworms and other inputs. Groups are now preparing. Preparation of bio manure was demonstrated.

Now weeding has been done on the plants.

Five groups were given drums for preparation of Pancha Kavyam

Trainings

Four trainings were organized at Kanchi training center. Three experts from agricultural department, viz. Mr. Saravanan from BDO office Pudhupalayam and Mr. Prabhakaran, Viswanathapuram and Krishnan, facilitated the trainings.
